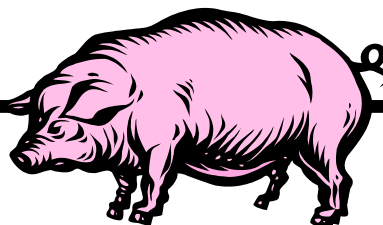
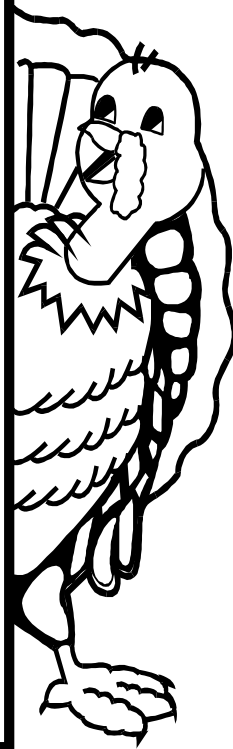

Dogs

Superintendent : Cathy Annese (622-9335)

All classes should be by **ADVANCED REGISTRATION** by July 5TH - Use Livestock Form.

- **An updated health and rabies certificate, and proof of license must accompany your pre-registration form.**
- Dogs must be kept on a leash at all times while on fairgrounds
- Dogs must be owned and cared for by the exhibitor by June 1st of current year.
- Ribbons will be awarded - excellent, very good and good in all classes
- **If dog is in heat, it cannot be shown**
- Each dog must be at least 4 months old
- Owners are responsible for cleaning up after his/her dog
- Any type/breed of dog may be entered
- Trophies will be awarded

Champion - Grooming and Handling

Champion - Obedience

Class

1. **Beginner Grooming & Handling - This class is open to first time exhibitors only.**
Judged on ability of exhibitor to handle their dog as well as how well the exhibitor has groomed their dog. Special consideration will be given as to how well the exhibitor and their dog interact. Exhibitors will be expected to answer questions about their dog.
2. **Grooming and handling - For exhibitors who have shown before.** Rules same as class number one.

Dog Obedience

Exhibitors who have trained their dogs for obedience are eligible to participate. Dog must be presented by the exhibitor. Scoring will be from AKC Obedience Trial Score Card. Obedience booklets are available from the 4-H office. Scored on basis of 160 points.

3. **Beginner A Dog Obedience - For first time Obedience exhibitors only.** This class is for dogs that have not gone beyond beginner's class. Dogs will be expected to perform; heel and sit, long sit, down, stand for examination, recall, and figure eight (8). Dogs will be on a leash.
4. **Beginner B Dog Obedience - For exhibitors who have shown in Obedience before.** Rules same as Class 3.
5. **Dog Agility on leash - Exhibitors will be asked to lead their dogs through a simple obstacle course.** Dogs must be on lead. Participation Award. **No premium money** will be awarded in this class.

Please read all rules - changes are made annually.

Rules For All Livestock Entries

1. **Advanced registration entries must be received by July 5TH.**
2. **All animals must be de-horned. However, horned breeds customarily shown in that way will be permitted.**
3. **The Greene County Youth Fair strongly suggests that a responsible adult supervise children as they show or handle their livestock and be on hand if assistance is required.**
4. **In order to participate and receive premiums all livestock exhibitors must enter the appropriate herdsmanship and showmanship classes.**
5. **Animals exhibited must be owned by the exhibitor or be a Non-owned Project animal of the exhibitor by June 1st of the current year.**
6. **See Animal Health Requirements (back of book).**
7. **"For Sale" signs or selling of animals is not permitted at the fair. Livestock will be disqualified from the show at the discretion of the Youth Fair Committee or Show Superintendent if the animal's behavior jeopardizes the safety of the showman in the ring, or fair goers.**
8. **Feed is to be furnished by exhibitors, bedding by the Fair.**
9. **The Greene County Youth Fair assumes no responsibility for any animals contracting a disease during the Fair.**
10. **All feed should be stored in closed containers. (see superintendent for clarification)**
11. **All feed and show equipment must be stored in assigned designated areas. (see superintendent)**
12. **Club signs and farm displays enhancing the exhibit are encouraged. Must stay up till 5pm Sunday.**
13. **Livestock will be disqualified from the show at the discretion of the Youth Fair Committee or Show Superintendent if the animals behavior jeopardizes the safety of the showman in the ring or Fair goers.**

NOTE: Exhibitors are limited to ages 5 to 21 as of January 1st of the current year. Exhibitors must reside in Greene County either full or part time, be members of a Greene County youth organization, or attend a Greene County school. Age on entry card must be as of January 1st of the current year.

ALL livestock must remain in place until 5:00pm Sunday no earlier or premiums points may be deducted.

Rules for Non-Owned Project Animals

1. Exhibitors may exhibit an animal that they or their family do not own. However that animal must be deemed a project animal by June 1st of the current year. Project animal forms for 4-H members are available in the 4-H Office; all others should contact the Greene County Ag Society for project animal forms. We discourage the purchase of show animals for the purpose of showing at the Fair after the June 1st deadline.
2. The animal identified on the Livestock Pre-registration form has been their project animal since June 1st of the current year.
3. The youth is responsible for the care and maintenance of the project animal to the best of their ability during the time period mentioned. He/she must keep accurate records on his/her project and be able to produce these records upon request from Youth Fair Management.
4. The youth exhibitor is the sole exhibitor of his/her project animal from June 1st through the Youth Fair.
5. Youth may enter a maximum of two non-owned project animal species per year.
6. All Non-owned Project Animal Registration Forms **MUST** be received by 4:00 pm on June 5TH. All forms should be sent to the Greene County Ag Society Office.

Exhibitors are required to follow the rules of the Livestock Superintendent and are expected to keep their livestock area clean and free from manure. Records must be up-to-date and presented if requested. There will be no reserving of stalls, except with the permission of the Superintendent of the Livestock Show.

All livestock must be in place by 6:00 p.m. the Wednesday before the Fair.

There will be a mandatory meeting of all livestock exhibitors with Livestock Superintendents 7:00 p.m. Wednesday night in the Livestock Show Tent.

Herdsmanship

Superintendent - Alice Zabel (768-2711)

In order to receive Premium Points all livestock exhibitors are required to enter the appropriate herdsman classes and must tend to their own animals for the duration of the Fair.

Herdsman awards will be awarded to the exhibitors who show themselves to be the best herdsman regardless of how many animals are entered in each section. This includes the following points: personal appearance, neatness and cleanliness of stalls or cages, bedding of animals on exhibit, manner in which he or she handles and cares for the exhibit, cooperation with superintendents in charge and with others in keeping the entire exhibit neat and attractive. This includes Cattle, Sheep, Goats, Swine, Rabbits and Poultry.

The Herdsman Committee will be responsible for judging the animal exhibits. Judges will walk through the tents and judge how each animal is being exhibited.

Your name should be clearly displayed on your exhibit.

HERDSMANSHIP CRITERIA:

- Is the exhibit area clean, neat, and attractive to spectators?
- Are tools and supplies stored in a proper and safe manner?
- Has the animals needs been met in a proper and timely manner?
- Water **MUST** be available to all animals at all times **NO** exceptions!

- Exhibitors must show good sportsmanship throughout the fair.
- Animals exhibits must be clearly labeled with exhibits name and herdsmanship number.

The Orloff S. Bear Sr. Master Showmanship Contest

- The Champion Showmen from the Dairy, Beef, Swine, Goat, Rabbit, Poultry, and Sheep shows will compete in the Master Showmanship Contest.
- Contestants will be judged on their skill as showmen and on the appearance their animals make before the judge. (This contest will not be judged on the fitting of the animal.)
- Contestants are responsible for finding their own animals for the contest.
 - A. Presentation of the animal in the show ring
 - B. Appearance of the showmen
 - C. Sportsmanlike behavior of the showmen

Display Contest

In an attempt to make the fair more attractive and welcoming, all exhibitors will be entered. A creative display that is to be exhibited on your animal's exhibit. One award will be given for the best display at the fair. This award will be announced at the closing ceremonies. Each animal must be individually identified with the following:

- Name and/or registered name of animal
- Class
- Breed
- Date of Birth
- Exhibitors name

An exhibitor may be disqualified from any Livestock Show at any time during the Fair. This is at the discretion of the judges and/or superintendents. Grounds for disqualification are as follows: if the exhibitor misbehaves, shows evidence of poor sportsmanship and /or treats their animal in a manner which the judge or superintendent deems as cruel, abusive and unnecessary.

All Livestock Exhibitors MUST assist in clean up. You must check with the department superintendent before leaving the fairgrounds Sunday evening.

Sheep – Section R3

Superintendent – Diane Lewis (239-5979)

Each exhibitor of sheep shall present a health certificate signed by an accredited veterinarian indicating that his flock is free of all contagious or infectious diseases and is not under quarantine. The Fair's official veterinarian must approve such a certificate in attendance at the fair before the animals are eligible for exhibition or competition.

Champion ribbons will be awarded as follows – Champion and Reserve Champion Fitting and Showmanship in each class; Master and Reserve Master Showman; Champion and Reserve Champion Market Lamb; Champion and Reserve Champion Ram Lamb of all breeds; Champion and Reserve Champion Ewe for each breed; Grand Champion and Reserve Ewe all breeds.

Classes may be combined or split at the discretion of the superintendent.

An animal can only be entered in one class with the following exceptions: dam and daughter, flock and get of sire. Animals in these classes must also have been entered and shown in one of the conformation classes in Section R3.

An individual may not enter more than two entries in a class.

Market Lambs cannot be shown in any breed classes. All animals must be owned by the exhibitor or be an official Project animal. (Forms are available from the 4-H & Greene County Ag Society offices.) Project animals may be exhibited in dam and daughter and get of sire classes as part of the originating flock.

DEFINITIONS:

Lamb – Under 1 year of age at time of show.

Yearling Ewe – Over 1 year but under 2 years of age at show time.

Mature Ewe - Over 2 years of age at show time.

Flock – Shall consist of 4 animals as follows: Three ewes and a ram lamb. Ewes must include at least one ewe lamb.

Dam and Daughter – daughter may be of any age. The object of this class is to show improvement from generation to the next.

Get of Sire – 3 progeny of any sex and any age sired by the same ram and belonging to the same flock.

Fitting and Showmanship – This event will be judged on the contestant's ability to show their own animal and on the grooming of the animal. Judging of grooming will be based on the condition of the feet, ears and cleanliness, condition and general appearance of the animal. Neatness of exhibitor is also considered in the judging of this class. Each contestant must show his or her own animal or their official Project animal.

Novice Fitting and Showmanship – This class is for those who have never shown before.

**ALL EXHIBITORS MUST ENTER AND PARTICIPATE IN THE FITTING AND SHOWMANSHIP CLASS
APPROPRIATE FOR THEIR AGE AND EXPERIENCE.**

A certificate indicating freedom from any contagious or infectious disease and exposure thereto must accompany all swine. Such certificate must be approved by the official veterinarian in attendance at the fair before the animals are eligible for exhibition or competition.

Superintendents - Kathy Cronce (731-2336)

Each goat exhibitor shall present a health certificate signed by an accredited veterinarian indicating that the herd is free of all contagious or infectious diseases. The official veterinarian must approve such certificates in attendance at the fair before the animals are eligible for exhibition or competition.

- Tattoos – Each goat must have a tattoo or identification ear tag when at the fair. **The tag or tattoo must match the veterinarian papers** and must be on animal.
- All goats must be shown with a collar and lead – no baling twine.
- All goats must be dehorned or they will be disqualified from competition.
- No more than 2 entries per class by each exhibitor.
- Any goat entered in this section, Section R5, **MAY NOT** be shown in the pack goat section, Section R6.

Enter only by having the Advanced Registration to the Greene County Ag Society office.

1. Showmanship is mandatory for all exhibitors whether in 4-H or not. Failure to participate will result in loss of all poultry premium points. **Exhibitors must supply their own feed. Exhibitors are responsible for feeding and watering their own animals.**
2. All birds except meat and crossbred for production & pet classes must be a purebred variety listed in the American Standard of Perfection, owned by the exhibitor or be a Project animal.
3. Each exhibitor is limited to a total of 10 entries in Classes 1 – 10 regardless of breed. No birds may compete for more than one prize. Birds entered as a trio may not be shown in individual classes or vice-versa. Trios consist of 2 pullets and 1 cockerel or 2 hens and 1 cock.
4. The Youth Fair reserves the right to refuse or to accept for exhibits any bird that shows disqualifications, evidence of disease, parasites, or lack of maturity.
*****Birds must be in show quality condition: clean, healthy, vigorous, mature, full feathered, and free of lice and mites. Birds not properly prepared for show cannot receive more than a “good” award.**
5. All birds must have be 4 months old of the current year, except meat classes.
6. Exhibitor tags will be available from the Poultry Superintendent on Wednesday, of the fair. Exhibitors are required to fill out the entire form. Classifications must be filled out properly. The Fair is not responsible for loss, mistake, damage or accident.
7. All birds, upon returning from the Fair, should be isolated from the home flock for 3 weeks or used for market purposes.
8. All placing will be on group basis. Judging will be on production basis for Egg Production classes. Standard breeds will be judged on the basis of the American Standard of Perfection.
9. Champion and Reserve Champion awards will be awarded in the following Classes: Standard Exhibition Bird, Bantam Exhibition Bird, Egg Production, Meat Production, Waterfowl, Other and each of the Fitting and Showmanship classes. There will also be Best of Show.

Note: Each poultry exhibitor must be checked out by the Poultry Superintendent at the end of the Fair to verify that his or her exhibit area is clean. Failure to do so may result in a loss of premium monies.

Attention Poultry Exhibitors

All poultry, except waterfowl and pigeons, shown at State or County Fairs shall have originated from the U.S. pullorum clean flocks or have a negative pullorum-typhoid test within 90 days of the Fair.

Chicken Classes

Poultry Showmanship – Mandatory for All

In this class exhibitors will have to show their bird outside the coop (cage) at the judge's direction. The exhibitor will be expected to answer questions about the parts of the chicken, as well as how to feed and care for poultry. Contestants will be rated excellent, very good, and good.

Eggs

The aim is to select and market eggs according to New York State Egg Grades. Eggs will be disqualified for: blood or meat spots: showing signs of incubation and individual eggs in a dozen not the same size. Eggs may be either white, brown or green. But no exhibit can consist of a mixture of white, brown or green.

207. **Pet class** – Doe or Buck (will be judged on Danish system only and no placings). Rabbits that have been spayed or neutered must be entered in this class.

Rabbit Showmanship – Mandatory for All

Those entering this class will have to show their rabbits outside the coop at the judge’s direction. Exhibitor should pose rabbit to show conformation or breed type. Senior class should be able to sex rabbit. Exhibitors in both classes should have knowledge of the parts of a rabbit, their uses, faults as to judging, and the care and raising of rabbits, as well as different breeds. Knowledge will be tested by the judge in a series of questions asked by the judge.

- 208. **Showmanship** – For exhibitors who are 14 years of age or older as of January 1st of current year.
- 209. **Showmanship** – For exhibitors who are 9 to 13 years of age as of January 1st of current year.
- 210. **Showmanship** – For exhibitors who are age 5 to 8 and over as of January 1st of current year
- 211. **Novice Showmanship** – exhibitors who are age 8 or older who are showing rabbits for the 1st time.
- 212. **Herdsmanship** – all rabbit exhibitors must enter this class. See description on page 7.

NOTE: Any exhibitor may choose to enter an age appropriate class. (one class only)

All rabbits must be checked by rabbit superintendent upon arrival to the fairgrounds. Do not put rabbits in cages until they have been seen and approved free of disease.

Section V - HORSES

Superintendent - Cathy Annese (622-9335)

Exhibitors and their horses must be registered in the Greene County Ag Society office before July 5th .

Exhibitors must fill out both the Horse Show Entry Form provided in back of book as well as the Greene County Youth Fair Livestock Entry Form and Premium Statement in order to participate and receive Premium Points.

All 4-H members must submit a copy of the completed 4-H Horse Project certificate and their Non-Owned Project Animal Form to the 4-H office by June 1st. Any exhibitor who is interested in participating in the Altamont and/or State Fair must notify the 4-H office. All participants must submit a copy of their Non-Owned Project Animal Form along with their registration forms to the Greene County Ag Society.

General Rules

1. **A copy of your current proof of negative coggins test and a rabies certificate MUST be attached to your Horse Show entry form – without exception!**
2. Rules for the show are those established in the official 4-H Show Rule Book Entitled “4-H Rules and classes for New York Horses.” Copies are available on line..
3. **Entrant must be between the ages of 8 to 19** as of January 1st of the current year. The Senior and Junior Divisions will be determined as follows: **Senior – contestants 14 years and older as of January 1st of current year; Junior – contestants age 8 – 13 years as of January 1st of current year.**
4. Walk–Trot Division is open to any first time exhibitor regardless of age. Riders over 12 years of age and older may participate in this Division only once. However, **once a rider moves up from the Walk-Trot Division they may not re-enter this division. Walk-Trot riders may not ride in any other division.**
5. Horse and rider will be disqualified from the show or excused from the ring at the discretion of the judge, Youth Fair Committee or show manager for any of the following reasons:
 - Misbehavior of horse and rider.
 - Evidence of poor sportsmanship.
 - Any treatment of the horse by its rider, which the judge deems is cruel, abusive, and unnecessary
 - Evidence that the horse is being over-worked during the Show.
6. In accordance to the New York State Ag and Markets, premiums will be paid to horses registered by July 5th .
7. Animals must be entered as either a pony or horse. A pony must be 14 .2 hands or less.
8. An exhibitor is limited to the use of one equine throughout the show.
9. Mounted exhibitors must wear safety headgear, ASTM F-1163 SEI CERTIFIED HELMETS.
10. No stallions will be allowed to participate in any class or be on the grounds during the show.
11. No riding on the grounds will be permitted, except by participants.
12. The show management reserves the right to cancel or combine any classes.
13. Awards will be given to High Point Riders in the following Divisions
 - Junior English – 1 or 2; 4 or 8; 16 or 18; 24; 27 or 28
 - Junior Western – 1 or 2; 6 or 8; 13 or 18; 21; 24
 - Senior English – 1 or 3; 5 or 8; 17 or 18; 25; 27 or 29
 - Senior Western – 1 or 3; 7 or 8; 14 or 18; 19; 24 or 25
 - Walk Trot – 1, 2, or 3; 9; 15; 26; 27
 - English & Western Games (Jr. & Sr.) – 32; 36; 38
 - Walk-Trot Games – 33; 35; 37; 39
14. **THE GREENE COUNTY YOUTH FAIR HORSE SHOW IS A QUALIFYING SHOW FOR THE ALTAMONT AND NEW YORK STATE FAIRS. YOU MUST QUALIFY IN YOUR DIVISION TO PARTICIIPATE IN EITHER OR BOTH OF THESE HORSE SHOWS. TO QUALIFY YOU MUST RECEIVE ONE (1) BLUE RIBBON IN EACH SPECIFIC CLASS(ES) YOU WISH TO QUALIFY IN.**

All exhibitors are required to enter the appropriate Fitting and Showmanship Class. It is mandatory for each horse section division exhibitor.

Class

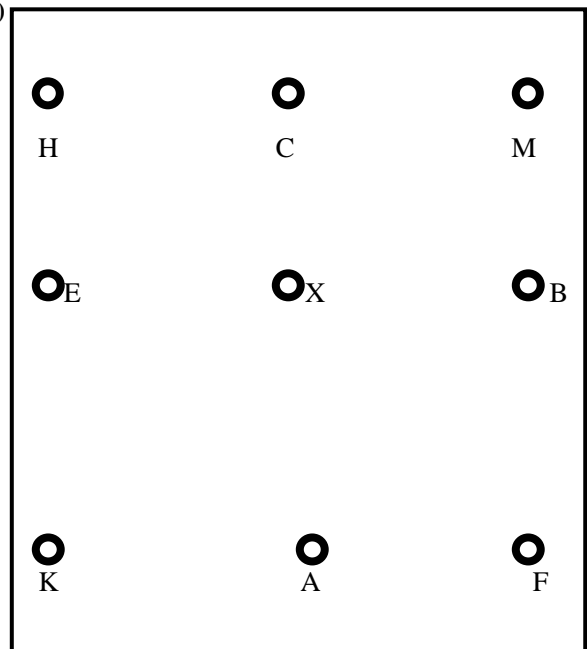
1. **Fitting and Showmanship – Beginner** – Horse or Pony. This class is open to **first time exhibitors only**. This class is judged on cleanliness of horse, training and manners of horse, and the way the exhibitor presents the horse to the judge.
2. **Fitting and Showmanship - Junior** – Rules same as class 1.
3. **Fitting and Showmanship - Senior** - Rules same as class 1.
4. **English Equitation - Junior** – Only the rider is being judged. Shall show at the walk, trot, and canter both ways in and around the ring. Care and condition of horse and tack are to be considered rather than their value.
5. **English Equitation - Senior** - Rules same as class 4.
6. **Western Equitation - Junior** – Only the rider is being judged. Shall show at the walk, jog or lope both ways in and around the ring. Care and condition of horse and tack will be considered rather than their value.
7. **Western Equitation – Senior** - Rules same as class 6.
8. **English and Western Equitation Pony – Junior and Senior** – Rules same as Classes 4 & 6.
9. **Walk-Trot/jog Equitation English and Western** – Exhibitors may not show in any other class except 9, 15, 25, 29, 33, 37, 39, Fitting and Showmanship and Costume Class. Beginning riders to walk and trot mounts both ways in the ring. Rider is judged on seat, hands, use of aids and the ability to control horse or pony.
10. **Lead Line Demonstration** – Open to all youth 5 to 8 years old. An adult or teen must accompany rider. Not to be judged. Participants will receive Participation Awards. No premium money will be awarded in this class.
11. **Costume Class**. Shown at walk only; lead line permitted. Before entering the ring each exhibitor must submit a 3x5 card with name of contestant, theme or explanation of costume. Cards will be read as participants parade around the ring. Costumes must be designed in a safe and nonrestrictive way for both the horse and contestant. All mounted contestants must wear helmets
12. **Programmed Riding – English or Western** – Junior & Senior – Riders will be asked to follow the specific pattern on page 22.
13. **Western Pleasure – Junior** – Horses to be judged on performance, manners and suitability for pleasure riding. Horses to be shown at the walk, jog and lope. Riders may be asked to back horse or stand quietly. Emphasis to be on the way of going with conformation also considered.
14. **Western Pleasure – Senior** – Rules same as Class 13.
15. **Walk-Trot/jog Pleasure** – Rules same as Class 13 but riders are limited to the walk and trot/jog.
16. **English Pleasure – Junior** – Horses to be judged on performance, manners and suitability for pleasure riding. Horses to be shown at the walk, jog, and canter. The judge may ask for an extended trot and for the horse to back and stand quietly. Emphasis to be on the way of going with conformation also considered.
17. **English Pleasure – Senior** – Rules same as class 16.
18. **English and Western Pleasure Pony - Junior or Senior** – Rules same as classes 15 and 16.
19. **Western Riding** – Horses will be shown walk, trot, and lope both ways of ring. Each rider will be asked to perform an individual test. IE: figure-eight.
20. **Road Hack English – Junior & Senior** – Horses to be shown at walk, trot, extended trot, canter, extended canter.
21. **Road Hack Western – Junior & Senior** – Horses to be shown at walk, jog and lope and extended lope.
22. **Command English/Western – Junior**
23. **Command English/Western - Senior**
24. **Trail - Horse and Pony – Junior** - Horses to be tested for manners and obedience over and through a series of obstacles that might be encountered in normal trail riding. More than one minute at any obstacle or three refusals constitute elimination of that obstacle. Failure to begin to negotiate an obstacle, or three refusals, regardless of time will result in a zero at that obstacle.

25. **Trail - Horse and Pony – Senior** – Rules same as class 24.
26. **Trail - Walk-Trot/jog – Junior & Senior** – Rules same as class 24.
27. **Cross Rail – Junior and Senior** – Exhibitors are required to jump sets of crossed rails less than 2’ high. Participants cannot participate in any other class over fences.
28. **Walt-Trot/jog Poles** – Same rules as Class 27.
29. **Hunt Seat Equitation Over Fences – Junior & Senior**– Only the rider is being judged. The rider shall be judged on seat, hands, guidance, and control of the horse while going over fences. The rider should be in a safe and suitable position while maintaining an even pace. The height of the jumps for this class will be a maximum of 2’.
30. **Working Hunter – Junior & Senior** - Entries in this class will show over a minimum of 6 fences. The height for this class will be a maximum of 2’6”.
31. **Working Hunter Pony** – Rules same as Class 30 except the jumps will be a maximum of 2’.
32. **Cloverleaf Barrel Race – Junior & Senior**
33. **Cloverleaf Barrel Race - Walk-Trot**
34. **Keyhole Race – Junior & Senior**
35. **Keyhole Race - Walk-Trot**
36. **Stake Race – Junior & Senior**
37. **Stake Race - Walk-Trot**
38. **Stake & Barrel Race – Junior & Senior**
39. **Stake & Barrel Race – Walk-Trot**
40. **Bareback Equitation – Junior & Senior** (Walk/Trot riders are not eligible for this class.) Only the rider is being judged. Shall show at the walk, trot, and canter both ways in and around the ring. Horse will not be under saddle. A bridle and reins must be used and the rider is required to wear a helmet.
41. **Sit-A-Buck – Junior & Senior.** Walk/Trot riders are not eligible for this class. Riders are to ride bareback with reins and bridles. The rider is required to sit on a dollar bill and while riding at the walk, trot,/canter. The rider who still has the dollar bill at the end of the exercise is the winner.

Animal Health Requirements

***The Youth Fair Committee USES the Guidelines set forth by the NYS Department of Agriculture and Markets for their Animal Health Requirements in this booklet.**

Preparation for the Fair:

- **Contagious Disease:** All animals must be free from contagious disease. *Examples* of contagious diseases for which animals have been denied entry or rejected from fair includes the following: ringworm, warts, mange, sore mouth, respiratory infection and contagious hoof infections.
- **Animal Identification:** Animals must be uniquely identified. Acceptable identification allows positive matching of the animal to all accompanying documents including papers with laboratory test results and vaccination statements. **If a sketch of photograph is to be used for official identification of an animal, the sketch or photograph must contain the signature of the attending veterinarian and date.** Horse sketches and descriptions should reference color pattern, hair whorls, chestnuts, scars and other markings. A name or a statement of color without additional distinguishing features or man made identification is not acceptable identification.
- **Isolation:** In addition to the possibility that the stress of moving can result in a healthy animal becoming ill, assembling groups of animals increases the chance of exposure to contagious disease. *All animals returning from a fair or show should be isolated from the herd or flock (no direct or indirect contact) for at least 2 weeks after returning to the premise of origin.*
- **Proof of Vaccination:** A signed, written statement from the attending veterinarian is required as proof of vaccination. A valid animal health certificate which has the vaccination(s) listed and is signed by the issuing veterinarian is acceptable proof of vaccination. The date of vaccination must be listed on all certificates.

Reasons for Fair Entrance Denial in Past Years

- Testing requirements not fulfilled
- Test time constraints not met
- Forged documents
- Mange, Ringworm, Warts, Respiratory Disease or other contagious disease
- Required vaccination time constraints not met
- Inadequate proof of vaccination
- Lack of or incomplete identification
- Identification between documents varies for the same animal

- **New York State Animals:** A valid New York State **intrastate CVI (form AI 61)** is required for: *Cattle, Sheep, Goats, and Swine*. Each animal must be individually and positively identified on the health chart. The CVI must be issued by an **Accredited Veterinarian** on or after May 1 of the current year.
- **A Valid Health Certificate:** For New York State animals the health chart must be completed within 45 days of the opening of the fair (the first fair your animal(s) will be on exhibition). The health chart must be issued by an Accredited Veterinarian.

Rabies Vaccination

In consideration of public health concerns, it is strongly recommended that **all mammals** to be exhibited at **any fair in NYS** be vaccinated against rabies. The NYS Interdepartmental Rabies Committee recognizes the probable efficacy and safety of killed rabies vaccine for off-label mammalian species; however, **in cases of rabies exposure**, the NYS Department of health cannot recognize, **as protected**, rabies vaccinated animals for which there is no licensed rabies vaccine. *Exhibitors should consult their veterinarian for further information.*

Proof of rabies vaccination **will be required at our Youth Fair** for those species that a USDA vaccine is available (cattle, cats, dogs, horses, goats, and sheep). The vaccine must be administered at least **14 days prior to arrival on the fairgrounds (July 7, 2011) but no greater than the labeled time specified for active protection against rabies**. The animal's rabies vaccination status must remain current throughout its stay on the fairgrounds. Rabies vaccination of all other mammalian species is strongly recommended.

Minimum Age for Vaccination: Animals **105 days of age or older** on the date of arrival at the fair must be vaccinated for rabies (for those species requiring vaccination).

Booster Vaccination: Animal previously vaccinated for rabies but whose vaccine status has expired, are eligible for exhibition upon receiving a booster vaccination. Proof of previous vaccination is required.

A fourteen-day rabies vaccination requirement is the minimum time frame that will help to ensure protection of animals against rabies while on the fairgrounds.

Fair Entrance Requirements by Species

Birds

1. **Pullorum – Typhoid** – For poultry (**doves, pigeons, and waterfowl are exempt**), certification that a negative pullorum typhoid test has been conducted within 90 days of the fair **OR** certification that the birds originate directly from a US pullorum-typhoid clean flock or a flock which has had an official test **within ONE year**. Pullorum testing must be

done yearly at the Youth Fair Clinic or you must present an updated certificate that states that your bird(s) originate from a pullorum free flock.

*****PULLORUM TESTING WILL NOT BE DONE AT THE FAIR*****

*****YOU MUST PRESENT YOUR CERTIFICATE STATING THAT YOUR FLOCK IS PULLORUM FREE WHEN SIGNING IN WITH THE POULTRY SUPERINTENDENT.*****

Cattle (to include steers and slaughter class cattle)

1. **Certificate of Veterinary Inspection** (with animals individually identified)
2. **Rabies Vaccination** - Proof of active immunization against rabies (see Rabies Vaccination).
3. **Bovine Respiratory Disease Complex** - Cattle three months of age and older must show proof of having been vaccinated against the common bovine respiratory disease viruses, at least 14 days prior to the opening day of the fair and not more than 90 days. Vaccination MUST include immunization against bovine viral diarrhea (BVD), bovine respiratory syncytial virus (BRSV), infectious bovine rhinotracheitis (IBR) and Parainfluenza (PI).
4. **Observe Milk and Meat Drug/Vaccine Labeled Withholding times.**

DOGS

1. **Rabies Vaccination** - Proof of active immunization against rabies (see Rabies Vaccination).
2. **Health Certificate - From an Accredited Veterinarian** - Proof that your dog is in good health and free from infectious diseases.
3. **License - proof of license with animal.**

Goats

1. **Certificate of Veterinary Inspection** - (with animals individually identified).
2. **Veterinary Statement** - The health chart must contain a written statement from the issuing accredited veterinarian certifying that there has been no evidence of contagious disease (animal or public health concern) in the herd of origin.
3. **Rabies Vaccination** - Youth Fair requires all goats to be vaccinated for rabies.
4. **Tattoos** - Each goat must have a tattoo or identification ear tag when at the fair. **The tag or tattoo must match the veterinarian papers and must be on animal.**

Horses

1. **Equine Infectious Anemia Test (EIA/Coggins)** - A valid EIA chart documenting that the animal has been tested (any USDA approved test) within the current or previous calendar years (2009 and 2010 for this fair season) and found to be negative for EIA infection, is required of all equines 6 months of age or older. The animal identification noted on all accompanying documents must match the description on the official EIA chart.
2. **Rabies Vaccination** - Proof of active immunization against rabies.

Sheep

1. **Certificate of Veterinary Inspection** - (with animals individually identified).
2. **Veterinary Statement** - The health chart must contain a written statement from the issuing accredited veterinarian certifying that there has been no evidence of contagious disease (animal or public health concern) in the herd of origin.
3. **Rabies Vaccination** - Proof of active immunization against rabies.

Swine

1. **Certificate of Veterinary Inspection** - (with animals individually identified).
2. **Veterinary Statement** - The health chart must contain a written statement from the issuing accredited veterinarian certifying that there has been no evidence of contagious disease (animal or public health concern) in the herd of origin.
3. **Rabies Vaccination** - Proof of active immunization against rabies.

To qualify in your division you must receive at least one Blue Ribbon in EACH SPECIFIC class(es) that you want to participate in at the Altamont and/or State Fair.

Exhibit and Premium Statement Rules

Please Read Carefully

Exhibits cannot be removed before 5:00 p.m. Sunday (except Horses). The Youth Fair will not be responsible for exhibits remaining after 6:00 p.m.

Failure to submit a premium statement form, to the Greene County Ag Society Office that includes every exhibit means no premium will be awarded.

Premium Statement Forms are available from the 4-H office, some local libraries, or the Youth Fair office at the Greene County Ag Society. ALL exhibitors must complete the Premium Statement. Therefore, please comply with the following procedure in order that you may be sure to receive premium money you earn.

1. Premium Statement Forms **MUST** be submitted to the Greene County Ag Society Office by July 5th . Changes may be made before the end of the fair if needed.
2. Section, class and exhibit description should be completed for EACH entry. Do not fill in award, or amount column. The bookkeeper will complete these when premiums are determined.
3. Please PRINT or TYPE clearly. Items should be listed in alphabetical order by Section and then numerically consecutive order by class number. Before writing on the premium form, make a complete list with Section and Class number, then arrange in order before entering on form.
4. You may make corrections, if necessary, during the Fair, but not after the Fair closes on Sunday.
5. The Youth Fair office will correct an error made in our calculation of premiums only if reported to the office within 60 days of date on check. The exhibitor must accept responsibility for loss of premium due to his or her own error or failure to cash the check within 60 days of date on check.
6. All premium checks must be cashed within 60 days from date on the check.
